

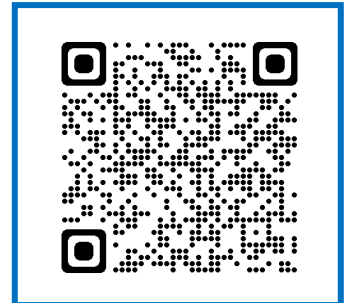
SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER



Course Description: In this 40-hour course you will learn the skills needed to nurture and protect students in an educational environment. Emphasis will be placed on the history of the SRO program, the importance of building a rapport with students, your role as a liaison between the students, parents, staff and community, work with staff to create an operations plan for the campus, recognize, detect and deter criminal activity on the campus, plan for and respond to emergencies, work with ESE students and learn the services available for them, recognize and respond to current trends in the schools, and explain the statutes and case law that relate to your duties and responsibilities.

Course Objectives: At the end of this program, students should be able to:

- Explain the SRO program in the State of Florida
- Build rapport with students
- Act as a liaison to, mediate between, counsel, and educate students, parents or guardians, staff or the community
- Conduct campus sweeps, provide security and create operations (OPS) plans for events
- Detect, deter and interview students about crime
- Identify, participate in plans for, and work with ESE students
- Explain the statutes and case law that relate to your duties and responsibilities

A student enrolled in a Specialized Instructor Training Course shall achieve a score of no less than 85% on the written end-of-course examination, exclusive of demonstration of any proficiency skills.

Attendance: Attendance at the initial class is mandatory. All students must adhere to the attendance requirements of the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and the Rules, Policies and Procedures of the Institute of Public Safety
